**NOTICE OF ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND BAR DATE FOR THE
FILING OF PROOFS OF CLAIM PURSUANT TO FED.R.BANKR.P. 3003(c)(2)
FOR KNOWN CREDITORS**

To individuals and entities upon whom the Debtor served this Notice and the Order on Motion to Set Bar date for Filing Proofs of Claim (Docket No. 106, the “Bar Date for Known Creditors”) (“Known Creditors”):

Please take notice that the Court has entered an order establishing procedures and a bar date for filing proofs of claim pursuant to Fed.R. Bankr. P. 3003(c)(3) by Known Creditors as follows:

- A. All proofs of claim which must be filed pursuant to Fed.R.Bankr.P. 3003(c)(2) by Known Creditors must be filed with the Court such that they are receive no later than **MARCH 17, 2026** (the “Bar Date”). Claims are not deemed filed until actually received by the clerk.
- B. Any claims filed by Known Creditors after the Bar Date will be disallowed. Any individual or entity that is a Known Creditor and is required to file a proof of claim by the Bar Date and that fails to do so will not be treated as a creditor for the purposes of voting or distribution, may not receive any further notices of mailings in this Chapter 11 case and any claim of such individual or entity will be forever barred.
- C. Any Known Creditor holding a claim arising prior to the date of Debtor’s Chapter 11 bankruptcy filing, **August 28, 2025**, must file a proof of claim with the Court if the claim is: (i) not scheduled; (ii) scheduled as disputed, contingent or unliquidated, or (iii) if such creditor disagrees with the amount of the scheduled claim.
- D. Following the Bar Date, a Known Creditor will not be allowed to amend a claim deemed filed on its behalf pursuant to 11 U.S.C. Section 1111(a) by virtue of the listing of such claim by Debtor in the applicable bankruptcy schedules.
- E. Claimants who have already filed their proofs of claim should not file a duplicate claim. Claimants who have filed a proof of claim may file an amended proof of claim by the bar date.

Any claim not timely filed with the Clerk by a Known Creditor within the time set forth above will be forever barred from sharing in the estate or being treated as a claim for purposes of voting or distribution.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that following the Bar Date, a Known Creditor will not be allowed to amend a claim deemed filed on its behalf pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1111(a) by virtue of the listing of such claim by Debtor-in-Possession in the respective bankruptcy schedules.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Debtor must serve a copy of this order, notice in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, and a Proof of Claim form to all Known Creditors and parties-in-interest pursuant to Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2002(a)(7) by **JANUARY 15, 2026**, and shall file a certificate of service evidencing same.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the form of Proof of Claim transmitted to the Known Creditors and parties in interest must comply with Official Form 410 in all respects, including the information contained on its reverse side.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Debtor's Motion is DENIED IN PART as to the relief requested as to the Potential Unknown Personal Injury Creditors, albeit without prejudice to the right of the Debtor to file a renewed motion to set a bar date for the filing of Proofs of Claim by the Potential Unknown Personal Injury Creditors. Such renewed motion must include more factual and legal detail to advise the Court of the Debtor's investigation as to the sufficiency of the proposed form and manner of notice. Furthermore, the Debtor shall provide citation to applicable case law adjudicating notice to potential unknown personal injury creditors in analogous cases. If the Debtor advocates for notice solely by a single publication in the USA Today newspaper, the Debtor must provide an analysis of alternatives and why the Debtor believes notice through the USA Today newspaper would be adequate and reasonable. The Debtor must serve any renewed motion upon the United States Trustee, the members of the Creditors Committee (and its counsel, if retained) and any other party in interest who has entered an appearance and request for notice in this case. The Debtor shall comply with L.B.R. 9013-1 and serve such renewed motion along with a L.B.F. 9013-1.1 affording 14 days to respond.
